Hearst Castle Run

On a fog shrouded morning in mid February, Ken Clark led a caravan of **ZONC** members to the HEARST CASTLE in San Simeon, CA. Initially there was a concern the low visibility would challenge any attempts to keep the group together. (The last car could barely be seen from the lead car.) But as the miles passed and the fog lifted, the news was good. The final car -- Ruffin and Lois Apperson's 350Z – could be seen in Ken's rear view mirror. OK, the Apperson's Z was the only other car on the HEARST RUN. But, that just made for a very intimate affair.



And it was a great chance for everyone to get to know each other. As mentioned, the run was to the Hearst Castle – creation and play ground of the famous newspaper tycoon, William Randolph Hearst. In the spirit of news gathering, Lois and Ruffin shared historical news about their ancestors.

Ruffin is, in fact, related to the Hearst Family though William Randolph's paternal grandmother, Phoebe Elizabeth continued on next column

APPERSON Hearst. Even more amazing... Ruffin's great, great, great grandfather, Edmund Ruffin, a 67 year old Virginia plantation owner, fired the first shot at FORT SUMTER in 1861, to start the Civil War.

Lois also counts American patriots in her family tree. Two of them paid the ultimate price as they fought alongside James Bowie and Davey Crocket at the Alamo.



History lessons continued the second day of our run, as the **ZONC** group toured a lesser-known landmark near San Simeon, namely the PIEDRAS BLANCAS LIGHT STATION. The lighthouse was built in 1874 to assist central coast whaling ships and cargo ships that sailed up the California coast to San

Francisco, hauling supplies to all those prospectors caught up in the gold rush. The information-packed, 2-hour tour of the grounds and buildings featured native plants, land and marine animals, historical events and restoration efforts.

The one significant landmark missing from the light station is the lighthouse lantern. The top 30 feet of the lighthouse

including the lantern have been removed for restoration. Lois and Ruffin found the lantern on display in downtown Cambria, about 15 miles down the coast.

A piece of trivia... PIEDRAS BLANCAS (white stones) got its name from Spanish explorers because of the white rock outcroppings in the nearby ocean. The rocks' white color comes from the centuries of birds living



and, well, relieving themselves on the rocks. History in the making, every day.

Ken and Mary also found natural history on display at the PIEDRAS BLANCAS ELEPHANT SEAL ROOYYKERY. Here, hundreds of mama seals are currently nursing their young continued on page 6



On the eve of California's fourth year of drought, it seemed like a safe bet to plan a trip to the top of Mt. Hamilton. But Mother Nature has been known to play cruel tricks and a dusting of snow from a March storm has happened in years past. Yet again, Rob Fuller had never been to the top of Mt. Hamilton in the 10 years, now almost 11, since he started up ZCAR GARAGE, so it was a must-do item. Combine that with a few bicyclists (and there's always a nasty one) on a very narrow road, ridiculously divided by a double yellow down the middle, and you have a difficult and thrilling drive. Fourteen Zcars (including a classic right hand drive Skyline) made the way up to the top and lo and behold, a line



of seven GT-Rs was waiting to greet us! After meeting the drivers and watching them take off, Jack Atkinson deployed his new Phantom II drone and took spectacular footage of the towering observatories with all of us and our cars in the parking lot below. Back in our cars, on we drove down the steep curves on San Antonio Road to the valley behind the observatories. While the day was a little hazy, there was plenty of blue sky and sunshine to light up the wildflowers along the roadway. 
