Beautiful ZDay in Atascadero

Northern California rocks! An estimated 1000 people gathered in Atascadero, CA on Saturday, March 18 to see 170 Datsun and Nissan sports cars for Z DAY CALIFORNIA presented by SoCalZ and Fast Intentions. Northern California early Datsuns and Zs showed well with two ZONCers earning awards: Linda Williams, Second Place 280Z, for her unmodified light blue metallic pinstriped 280Z; and Rob Fuller of ZCAR GARAGE, Best Sponsor Car, for Alex M.'s right-hand drive 1973 **Skyline GT.** This low-slung sports car is frequently seen parked at Rob's shop in San Jose. Also walking away with top prizes were Matt A. and Curtis Lewis. Matt, a loyal ZCG customer, won the top Best of Show prize

Clear blue skies. Twisty roads. And good company. Those are the key ingredients for a memorable run. And, boy, did we have them in spades on April 9.

The run continued from there, but I had to break off. The fun was far from over, though. For miles, I had the downward descent to San Jose all to myself. I savored every corner until a minivan decided to ruin the fun a few miles from town. But even then, a smile was plastered on my face.

That's two wildly successful events in the book for 2017, and there's more to come. Next up is the Z Gathering at the BLACKHAWK AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM on May 20 (see flier on page 5). This was one of our more popular events last year and I expect this year's to be no different.

The following week, DATSLOCOS will hold its 13th annual car show and swap meet on May 27 at 934 Perimeter Drive in Manteca. The cost to enter a car in the show is \$10. Given the support Datslocos has shown **ZONC**, it would be fantastic to see **ZONC** return the favor.

The **ZDAY** car show stretched along both the north and south sides of City Hall and around a central park with a large fountain, big trees, green grass and plenty of park benches. **Bill Hickman's** orange **240Z**, **Marshall Adams**' brown metallic **260Z**, **Linda's 280Z** and **Matt A**.'s **510** were some of the very few Datsuns to enter the show. **Andrea Ivan's** cherry red 'ZMario' and **Mo Moscovitz's** silver '1Z324Mo' were parked in a line of stock to very modified **Z32**s on the northwest side of the parkway. MINES ROAD/PATTERSON SPRING RUN

Finally, after all these years of transporting my energetic, crazy triathlete owner and her bike to the base of this climb she is forever raving about, I got to do it too! And not only did I finally get to do that climb but I got to ride over a few other roads of other bike rides she has done while I am patiently waiting in some parking lot in Patterson or Pleasanton for her to finish!

I must say, that ever since we have joined this Z Club, I have gotten' a lot of attention. We went to a **Z DAY** in Atascadero, and I got to meet all these other Zs! But none of them have more miles than I do on their original engines and transmission, but they are all very nice cars just the same. My owner is very proud of me, and has taken good care of me for the last 20 years, so I have tried to show her that I have just as much endurance as she does!

And so the time was approaching for this ride she designed, which is one of her favorite bike rides: Mines Road in Livermore to Mt. A group called Datslocos! These were 510 Datsun's, much older than me! I don't remember them, but my owner does, and she loves these little cars! Their owners have put in these racing type engines, so they go very fast, and they really are quite cute and I could see they are greatly loved also by their owners.

One of the 510 Datsun's (Omar's orange beauty) was behind me, and he kept me under control from going too fast from all the excitement, as I had to remember I was the leader of the parade, and it is important to stay together.

Right when we turned onto Mines from Tesla, though, something happened to one of the Datsun's. His owner (Jason 'Towns' Townsend) apparently had left the oil cap loose and it fell off. So, off they went back to Livermore to get another oil cap, but I had no doubt he would catch up with us later.

We continued up the road, and we must have been a sight to see, 15 Zs and 510 Datsun's snaking their way up this beautiful road, with lush green valleys full of beautiful wildflowers, and streams which haven't appeared in over 10 years. My owner kept telling me how it hasn't been like this in all the years she has been riding her bike up this mountain, and it was a wonderful sight to see. She also kept saying how nice it was to be driving me on this road for a change. All the while she kept her eye on my odometer, and was calculating





where I would hit 330,000 miles, and she kept saying, "It's going to be at the Junction."

I'm sure this Lexus felt a little out of place, but he seemed a good sport also) as we turned on Concannon to head home.

What a great day, and what a wonderful way to celebrate 330,000 miles!! I can't wait until I hit 500,000!!!
