SoCal Z-Day California Car Show

ZONC members captured 2/3rds of the Datsun Z trophies at SoCalZ's 4th annual **Z-Day California** car show in Atascadaro, CA, March 10, 2018.

The awards included 1st place honors for **ZONC** President, Linda William's 1978 280Z, Oscar Lemus's 1973 510, llnm and Bill Hickman's 1971 240Z. Ken Clark earned 2nd place for his 1970 240Z. Former **ZONC** member Curtis Lewis also entered the show with his 370Z. It's a 2-time winner at previous SoCalZ events.

Tony Anaya, Z-Day organizer and owner of SoCalZ.net (a Datsun/Nissan performance parts online retailer) said the trophies are great, but his real goal is just to "bring people together and celebrate all things Z!" Over 160 cars were showcased at the event, down a bit from the number registered in 2016 because of the rain. Tony's 2010 turbo 370Z remained in the garage for just that reason.

Thankfully, others braved the elements, including **Best** in **Show** winner, David Caroll from Morgan Hill, CA. His highly-modified 280Z featured a Chevy LS motor. This car is not only a beauty. But, it's a champion in autocross competitions. That double duty of performance with style punched its ticket at SoCalZ's Z-Day.

Performance driven is also how Tony describes the SoCalZ organization and its followers. A look under the hood of most of the show entries proves the point. Nissan 350Z and 370Z comprised the majority of the entries, and many were highly modified. Some had lowriding systems for controlled drops and rises, assisted by air ride suspension. Several cars featured highly modified exhaust systems. Aldolfo Ascencio of Oxnard, CA, captured 1st in the "Two Step" exhaust sound battle with a 1991 twin-turbo 300ZX. Flames out the tail pipes are an added attraction.

Atascadaro, CA, might not seem a prime location to attract Z car enthusiasts. But, SoCalZ's Z-Day proved that if you stage a show in the middle of the state, it's a doable drive from the north and south. Icing on the cake—it was Atascadaro who made the call to socalz, persuading them to step away from Pismo Beach (the site of 2015-16 Z-Days) by offering a prime show location on the streets surrounding the historic Atascadro city hall. (A win for everyone.)

Speaking of winning, Tony had a special observation regarding Linda Williams' 1st place in the 280Z category. He said Linda's car was so "true to original." Most everything from the original paint through the engine and interior had not been altered and instead preserved in pristine condition. Tony said, "that car belongs in a museum." Quite a compliment, Linda.

Cruising Past Fire and Snow

Rain or shine, Berryessa was fine! Winter showed up just in time for the Contra Costa Cruise to Middletown and Lake Berryessa on Saturday, March 3. Fearless **ZONC**ers Ken Clark and Mary Rozmajzyl (240Z), Chuck Moll (280Z), Linda Williams (280Z), Carol and Bob Gray (350Z), Susan and Mike Keller (350Z), Ruff and Lois Apperson (not in their 350Z), Andrea Ivan (not in ZMario) and Paul Gommel and I (350Z) defied the weather forecast and hit the road. Jacob Mattson (350Z Nismo), who hosted our start at Specialty Sales Classic Cars, and Katie met us for the Contra Costa area start in Pleasant Hill. Jacob led the way to Specialty Sales' showroom at the Cordelia junction in Fairfield. We enjoyed sunshine for our park-n-show at the Specialty Sales parking lot, but mostly everyone was inside looking at the fabulous cars in the showroom and snacking on coffee and doughnuts provided just for us. Impala, Cobra, Bel Air, an outrageous custom 1950 Ford and muscle cars galore, they had everything except our Z's in the parking lot! Specialty Sales was so nice, it was difficult to get everyone back into their cars for the Cruise.



Once we were on our way, we started up Hwy. 12 to Napa driving on clear roads beneath a threatening sky. Heading up the Silverado Trail, we made our way through showery weather in light morning traffic. Once we reached Calistoga, rain fell a little harder as we headed up Hwy. 29 to Robert Louis Stevenson Park atop Mt. St. Helena. We passed a little patch of snow on the ground at the crest of the mountain and then headed down to Middletown in the rain. We stopped for lunch at the Mt. St. Helena Brewery with plenty of available street parking. Lunch was good once the food arrived and we had a brief general meeting with plenty of conversation and laughter while we waited for everyone to be served.

The rain had stopped when we left the restaurant and snow-covered hills were northwest of us as we left Middletown. We headed northeast on Hwy. 29 and turned on Butts Canyon Rd. This road has been the scene of several fires in recent years and the scars from last year's fire were easily seen. White picket fences around the Guenoc vineyards at Langtry looked fresh and new against blackened hills. In other places, houses and ranch buildings somehow were saved but the trees and bushes around them were destroyed.

Driving across the county line through the hills into Pope Valley, all turned green and springtime delightful. We quickly crossed through Pope Valley and turned southeast to Lake Berryessa. We stopped for a break at Smittle Creek Day Use Area and parked our cars in an otherwise empty parking lot. No other cars, no other people, no bicycle traffic equals perfect driving ... until Chuck Moll had some fuses go out. His windshield wipers had stopped working earlier in the morning, but then in the afternoon his CD player also failed so he stopped to check out his electrical problems at Turtle Rock.

The rest of us didn't know what had happened and we worried while we waited for Chuck at the Monticello Dam. No Chuck and the skies were darkening with rain clouds. We took some group photos, but still no Chuck. We figured he may have taken a different way home – or hit a bicyclist and was on his way to jail – so off we went, driving along beautiful Putah Creek and then turning on Pleasants Valley Rd. By this time, a cloudburst hit and we had some heavier rain. We parted ways at I-80. Those of us returning to Contra

Super Saturday Castle Air Museum Car Show April 28, 2018

Here's a "Super 2-for-1 Event" for car lovers, no matter the make, model or year. And it comes with the added attraction of American military aviation history. It's the **Annual Super Saturday Castle Air Museum Car Show**, Saturday, April 28.

For one day only, this year, the **Castle Air Museum** is inviting anyone with a car, truck, boat, "rat rod" or motorcycle to display their rides alongside the museum's 65 meticulously restored aviation icons including the Boeing B-52 bomber, Bell H-13 MASH helicopter, and the General Dynamics F-16 Fighting Falcon. That's right. You can show off your beauty in the shade of the Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird, a mach 3 strategic reconnaissance aircraft.

A \$40 "early entrance fee" gets you and your car on the tarmac and eligible for event awards. You will also be entered in a drawing for (2) \$100- cash drawing. After April 1, 2018, the entry fee is \$45.

Spectators will find plenty of parking near the museum and a nominal entrance fee of \$5. Normally adult admission to the museum is \$20. That's what makes this event so super—two times the viewing pleasure at less than half the price. There will be live music, food trucks and helicopter rides (\$40).
