Monterey 2018! Last Call!

ZONC's ticket window is closed and the deal is done! As host of the Datsun Nissan Sports Car Corral at the 2018 Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion, **ZONC** sold 187 admission tickets to Datsun Nissan drivers from the East Coast, Canada, Washington, Oregon, Arizona, Nevada, New Mexico and home state, California. 146 sports car drivers, including 44 **ZONC** members have signed up and 125 of our cars will take to the track for a ceremonial parade lap.

Several exciting last-minute developments have happened since our ticket window closed. There are rumors flying that ItalDesign's GT-R50 will be there and other rumors that the new Z will be unveiled – but we have no advance information about any of that. We can confirm that WeatherTech Raceway expanded our corral to include the island where we can park up to 30 cars. Gayle Brock was incredibly kind to give us priority in Peter's scheduling and we are looking forward to seeing Peter visit our corral on Saturday morning and again on Sunday for our parade lap. Gayle also sent a copy of the paddock map showing the Nissan tent, grouped together with BRE and Stillen in the paddock just over the tire bridge from our corral. Datsun Row is moved up to the second row of the pits. It is so amazing to see our brands front and center in the showplace spots in the paddock.

Each day will bring non-stop fun. Adam Carolla will be

taping his podcast in the paddock on Saturday from noon to 1 p.m. Following Adam's gig, Murray Smith will be the moderator for a "Picnic in the Paddock" from 1:10-1:35 p.m. and will be talking with John Morton, Steve Millen and Peter. After that, from 1:35-1:50 p.m., Sir Jackie Stewart and Chris Cord will present a Remembrance of Dan Gurney. On Sunday, we will take our cars on the track for a parade lap and take a turn on the world famous Corkscrew.

If you didn't get a chance to sign up for the corral and parade lap, you can still buy admission tickets (but no corral or parade lap passes) from WeatherTech Raceway until August 20. Join us for tours of the paddock, visits with celebrities and watching the races! If you decide to go, let me know and we'll make sure you have all the info you need for this once-in-a-lifetime event. See you there!
