

#### Mecum Auctions Rogers Z Collection

Mecum Auctions sold eight museum quality Zs from Mike and Debbie Rogers' car collection on August 19, 2023, at the Del Monte Golf Course in Monterey. Mecum displayed the cars as a collection in the main auction tent, allowing everyone to see the cars on opening day and then wait for the auction on Saturday, the last day of the three-day event. Mecum did an excellent job of presenting the cars and gave each one a high value estimate. And Mecum got excellent results. In order of sale, here are the very special Zs that were offered and sold:

Lot S82, 1970 Nissan Fairlady Z432, \$297,000. This JDM Z is 1 of 299 built from 1969-1970. The 432 model stands for its engine built with 4 valves per cylinder, 3 carburetors, and 2 camshafts. The engine is said to have come from the Prince Motor Company that produced it for the Skyline GT-R. Nissan paired it in the Z432 with a 5-speed transmission. This car won Best of Show at ZCON in 2021. Without question, it is a very special Z and was the highest sale in the





Rogers' auction collection.

**Lot S83, 1972 Datsun 240Z, \$66,000.** Nissan had a short-lived Vintage Z program in 1996 that restored old original Zs with new Japanese OEM parts. This lime yellow Z is one of those Nissan Vintage Zs. It has been driven and shows 47,709



Lot S84, 1969 Datsun 240Z, \$132,000. This pristine white Z recently completed an 8-year restoration at ZCar Garage. It is serial number 193 of the 538 240Zs produced in 1969 but sold as 1970 240Zs. A picture book was on display with the car and opened to a photo of the 240Z at ZCar Garage, with a handwritten note, "ZCar Garage took it to the next level." It could not have been more perfect.

#### Lot S85, 1980 Datsun 280ZX 10th Anniversary, \$231,000.


Here we have the Queen of 280ZXs, one of only 500 anniversary cars painted in red and black and with only 25 miles on the odometer. The story behind this car is of love and care by a Datsun dealer who received the car after being a top seller. Other lesser dealers would get one of the 2500 black and gold versions of the anniversary model. The dealer-owner is said to have kept the Z in storage for 42 years before selling it to the Rogers. The car has since won numerous awards at ZCON including Most Original Z in 2022, 1st Place for stock 280ZX and 1st Place People's Choice. The final auction price far exceeded its estimated value of \$150,000-200,000.



#### Lot S86, 1984 Nissan 300ZX Turbo 50th Anniversary,

**\$49,500.** 1984 is the first year that Nissan changed the Z design quite a bit, substituting a V6 engine in place of the tried and true inline 6. This Anniversary Turbo model was produced with a special body kit painted in metallic silver with black accents. Despite its rarity with only 5,148 built, this Z was the lowest seller of the auction group.

#### Lot S87, 1978 Datsun 280Z Black Pearl Edition, \$90,200.

The black pearl paint and red pin-striping on this Z is spectacular, especially considering that the car is original and unrestored. This striking 280Z has rear window louvers. Black paint had not been seen on a Z until 1978 when, for the first time, Datsun produced cars in a color they had avoided because of its cultural association with death. But black was instantly a very popular color in the United States and still looks fantastic today.



#### Lot S88, 1977 Datsun 280Z ZZZAP Edition, \$71,500. This

Z, in Sunburst Yellow paint, sports a special décor package along with rear window louvers. The ZZZAP badging was connected to a video game, 280 ZZZAP, and was the first time a product was placed and promoted in a video game. This car was restored and was recently shown at ZCON 2023 in Ontario before shipping to Monterey for the auction.

Lot S89, 1983 Nissan 280ZX Turbo, \$99,000. The second biggest surprise of the day, this 280ZX Turbo also beat its projected value of \$50,0000-75,000. This is the last year that Zs had inline 6 motors and the last year for the S130 body. It was also the last car of the Rogers collection to go up on the Mecum auction block. Sadly, we were not able to get a good photo of it, but take our word for it, it deserved every penny that it got.

Other Datsuns and Nissans were offered by Mecum in Monterey. Lot T191, a 1972 Datsun 240Z went for \$33,000. It was in very good shape, having had only 1 owner who put 24,100 miles on it. Lot F48.1, a 1971 Datsun 240Z Custom Roadster, modified with an LSX V-8 crate engine, sold for \$46,200. Lot T214, a 1996 Nissan Skyline R33 GT-R was auctioned for \$57,200 with restrictions that it be sold out of state or to a dealer. Three other cars were DNS - did not sell. A bronze metallic 240Z, a black 2008 350Z and a black 2003 350Z Touring were in such bad shape, no one wanted to bid on them. The highest offer for the 2008 350Z was \$7,000. Some might think they would be lucky to get that.

Auctions, and particularly Mecum, can be an adventure with the good, the bad and the ugly. Not every auction has an outstanding collection of Datsun and Nissan Z cars that can bring astronomical prices. The Mecum 2023 auction was special and surprising in high sales prices that recognized the history, performance, and beautiful condition of the Rogers' Zs. At the end of the auction, it was easy to see that early Z cars remain strong favorites here in the United States and in the sports car world at large.
