MY 2023 Z

My purchase of the new 2023+Z started in 1973 when I bought the "hot ticket" sports car of the 1970s: the Datsun 240Z.

When it was released in 1970, Road&Track magazine's review called it a "...super bargain". Car and Driver called it "...brilliantly conceived". Every young adult looking for their first sports car wanted it and drove up demand to the point that a year after its release a used 240Z was selling for \$500 above list for a new 240Z!



College graduation, first real job, and the Vietnam Draft all conspired to delay my purchase until I got back to the US in December of 1972, after 11 months on an aircraft carrier deployed to Vietnam. On April 14, 1973, after 4 months on a wait list, I sat in a new Blue Metallic 240Z for the first time and drove it off the lot. What a rush! I've been enamored with that Z and subsequent Z models ever since. I still have that 240Z.

So when I saw the Reveal of the new Z at the 2021 ZCON in Colorado Springs I knew I had to have the Seiran Blue one!

In late 2022 when the new Z began arriving at dealerships, I started driving to every Nissan dealer within 100 miles of my home looking to get on their wait lists for a new blue Z. No Luck - as Nissan dealers were only getting one each that year at best. And charging outrageous markups. Finally started using Nissan's website search feature in December and saw that no dealer on the west coast had a blue Z in stock or even coming in. In early 2023 I noticed that blue Zs were starting to arrive at Nissan dealers in the Midwest, South, and East Coast. Ultimately I negotiated a satisfactory deal with a Chicago dealer and arranged to complete the purchase on April 14, 50 years to the day after buying my 240Z.

Drove the new Z back to California on back highways. No Interstates. US Highway 50 through Kansas, Colorado, Utah, and Nevada. Did a lot of sightseeing on the way. Stopped at the Tall Grass Prairie National Preserve, the Cosmosphere Space Museum, Boot Hill, Pikes Peak, Garden of the Gods, Monarch Pass (11,320 ft altitude), the Black Canyon of the Gunnison, Ouray CO, the Loneliest Highway in America, and Lake Tahoe. Great fun!

Now we are home and I feel like I am 24 years old again!








My New Z
